This past month our small community has had more than its share of young children with serious and even critical physical illness. Which causes us to stop and ask ourselves: why so many children all at once? And why do children have to suffer in such ways in the first place? As a church and as a community we are asked to pray for all those in need of prayer. But there's something about the suffering of children that really pulls at our hearts. So in the midst of our prayers for these little ones, a troubling question comes to our minds: why do some of the children for whom we pray get well, and others don't? In other words, at the end of the day, we're really asking: does prayer really matter; does it really accomplish anything? Such questions are not only familiar, but they have been asked over and over again almost since the beginning of God's relationship with humankind.

In this short article I wouldn't even attempt to answer such questions, (I don't have the insight to answer even if I was writing a book). But there is one thing about which I feel very confident: prayer is an act of faith. Regardless of our attitude toward the capacity of prayer to be effective in reaching God and attaining positive outcomes, the reality is, prayer is an act of faith. We pray simply because we have faith in God. So even when we can't justify prayer as being effective. Even when we

don't feel that our small voice is being heard amid all the world's noise. Even when we question whether God even hears or cares about our prayers. And even when we don't realize any positive

outcomes from our praying. Prayer is an act of faith. In other words, prayer is our personal expression in our belief there is a God, our belief that our God is present with us, and our belief that God cares deeply for our lives and the lives of others.

Luke's account of Jesus' prayer in the garden the night before his death is helpful to us here. Jesus prayed...*Father, if you are willing, remove this cup from me; yet, not my will but yours be done. (Luke 22:42, NRSV).* Jesus' prayer was an act of faith. And important to our discussion here, it was a prayer that the Father did not answer. As we all know, Jesus suffered horribly on the cross the very next day. But Jesus modeled a life of prayer that was first and foremost, a life of faith and trust in his Father's good intentions. That's why Jesus prayed as he did, and that's why we pray. Because prayer is our act of faith.

Cinnamon Apple Crostata

Crust: 1 Pillsbury Refrigerated pie crust (from 15 oz. package)
Heat oven to 450°. Bring pie crust to room temperature as directed on package. Unfold crust; place on ungreased cookie sheet. Press out fold lines.

Filling:

- 1/2 cup sugar
- 4 tsp cornstarch
- 2 tsp cinnamon
- 4 cups (4 medium) thinly sliced peeled apples
- 1 tsp sugar
- 2 T. chopped pecans or walnuts

In medium bowl, combine sugar, cornstarch, and cinnamon. Mix well. Add apples and toss gently. Spoon apple mixture onto center of crust, spreading to within 2 inches of edges. Fold edges of crust over filling, and ruffle decoratively. Brush crust edge with water; sprinkle with 1 tsp sugar. Bake at 450° for 15 minutes or until crust is golden brown. Sprinkle pecans over apple mixture. Bake an additional 5 to 15 minutes or until apples are tender. Serve with whipped cream if desired.

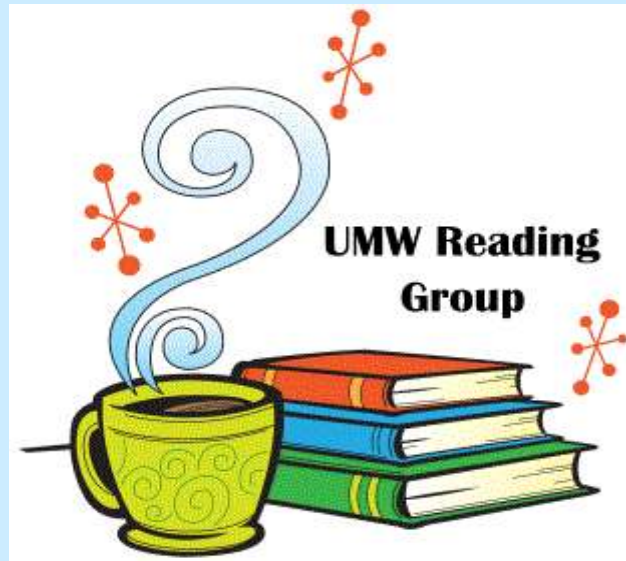

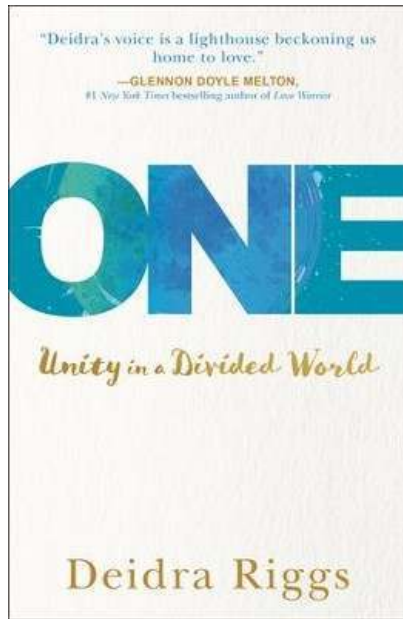

UMW BOOK REVIEW

ONE - Unity in a Divided World

Deidre Riggs' prayer in writing *One, Unity in a Divided World*, is that the book will help people "face the hard truths about ourselves...[and] surrender to the process of first being reconciled to God, and then to ourselves so we may finally be fully reconciled to others - even those we now call our 'enemy'".

As the author notes, striving for complete unity in a world with so much division is a "thermal shock" to our systems.

In this book author Deidre Riggs explores what it means to be unified and how we might go about achieving this unity.

The book has two basic ideas (quote):

1. A basic acknowledgement: We are all divided, and the church is no exception.
2. A basic call to follow the way of Jesus: "Oneness is God's desire for us. Unity is what Jesus prayed for us. The odds are definitely in our favor.

The book explores places where there is still giant division such as "black and white" churches. Think about our congregation. We enjoy the fellowship with other "people of color" but do not try to unify. We are open to it but don't "go after it". We find it hard to unify churches of different denominations not to mention different "colors". Deidre believes it can be done but only if we are (ALL of us) intentional. It may take you out of your comfort zone but it will be worth it, according to Ms. Riggs.

Ms. Riggs says she is very intentional about this but also admits she has fallen short many times. She hasn't let that deter her efforts.

A quote from the book, "We don't have to choose to be merciful when someone offends us or betrays us or uses us...[But] When we begin from the seat of mercy, we move ourselves out of the way and we make way for God's perfect administration of justice...God's goal is always unity and healing, oneness, and reconciliation. So he invites us to begin with mercy..."

I admit to struggling with this book. I was determined to finish it and found her personal stories of how she has had success and failure in the quest for unification kept me interested enough to finish. I do think it is worth the read even if you can't quite wrap your head around the immense challenge.

As AN ASIDE: Mt. Pleasant UMC in Louisa is hosting a "Book and Brunch" from 9:00 a.m. until noon on Saturday, October 19, and the book is **ONE, Unity in a Divided World**. It is a UMW book and we have a copy. Through my friend Joan, who is a member there, our church is invited to attend, which was another reason for me to finish the book! Jane and I have been to at least one of their other brunches. We found it enjoyable and a learning experience aside from the good food. Please let me know if you can attend. Hopefully there will be a car pool from our church. I do not have a deadline yet but I know they'd like to know sooner than later.
